INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON LOCATING HUMAN RIGHTS-TRAJECTORIES & DISCOURSES (ICLHTD)



The Human Rights Forum under the Department of History & Political Science, organized a Two Day International Virtual Conference on December 11 and 12, 2020 in

connection with International Human Rights Day. The International Conference tilted LOCATING HUMAN RIGHTS-TRAJECTORIES & DISCOURSES (ICLHTD) was organized in collaboration with Manoj and Chitra, International Legal Service Providers. On Day 1, the Inaugural session was presided over by the College Principal Dr. Deepa M. The Head of the Department of History, Dr Lekha Rani M. L. welcomed the dignitaries. Padma Bhushan Justice K.T. Thomas, Retd. Judge, Supreme Court of India, inaugurated the Conference by highlighting the importance of Human Rights by focusing on the Articles of the Indian Constitution. Dr J. Ravindran, International Human Rights Law Expert delivered the Keynote address. We also had the good fortune to have Justice Antony Dominic, Chairman, Kerala State Human Rights Commission who gave a Special Lecture during the inaugural session. This was followed by the taking of the Human Rights Pledge by all the participants. The Pledge was read out by the Student Coordinator of the Human Rights Forum, Megha Bijukumar. There was an interesting interactive session after this wherein all the speakers answered the queries posed by the participants and gave their viewpoints and valuable suggestions. Dr Parvathy Menon, Coordinator of Human Rights Forum and Convener of the Conference, proposed the Vote of Thanks. There were around 100 participants including academicians, professionals, and research scholars for the session.

The Afternoon session of Day 1 was a Plenary Session for which Dr Reshmi R. Prasad, Dean of Academic Affairs delivered the welcome address. Swapna Sundar, IP Strategist and Patent Agent, University of Tennessee spoke on the topic IPR from a Human Rights Perspective. Dr V.R. Jayadevan, Principal, Government Law College, Thrissur highlighted the importance of Human Rights with reference to the Constitution of India. Dr Sindhu Thulaseedharan, Associate Professor & Head, Department of Law, University of Kerala gave her perspective on Property Rights and Gender Equality. This was followed by a very interesting Question and Answer session. Dr Vijayakumari K. Assistant Professor, Department of History proposed the Vote of Thanks.

On Day 2 there were 2 Panel Discussions, one in the morning session and the other in the Afternoon session. The theme for the Morning session was "Human Rights and Gender". The moderator was Shahina Ali, Assistant Professor in Political Science from Mahadevananada Mahavidyalaya, West Bengal. The speakers were Dr Kavita Lalchandani, Principal, K.C. College, Mumbai, Dr J. Devika, noted Historian and Professor, Centre for Development Studies, Trivandrum and Dr Kavitha Balakrishnan, Former Dean and Head,

School of Legal Studies, Kannur University. There was an interesting interactive session towards the end.

The theme for the Panel discussion in the Afternoon session was "Human Rights and Law". Adv. Manoj Pillai, Supreme Court of India and Member- Law Society of England and Wales was the session moderator. The speakers were Shaan Libby, Barrister-at- Law, Honourable Society of Lincoln's Inn, U.K, Dr Sheeba Pillai, Professor, School of Indian Legal Thought, M. G. University and Joel Sebastian, LLM in International Law from SOAS, University of London. This was followed by an excellent Question and Answer session.

At the Valedictory session which followed later, Dr Vidya Nair Assistant Professor in Political Science welcomed the Speaker who was K. Sanjay Kumar Gurudin IPS, Inspector General of Police, Trivandrum Range. The speech was very informative to all the participants, especially the student community as it was on Cyber crimes and Human Rights violations pertaining to them. The highlight was a lively interactive session in the end. Adv. Manoj Pillai of Manoj and Chitra, International Legal Service Providers, who collaborated with the Human Rights Forum in organizing this Two Day International Conference, proposed the vote of thanks.



Course Summary

Introduction to Research Ethics(PHY-A-20-2)

The add on course on 'Introduction to Research Ethics' is organized and conducted by the Department of Physics, All Saint's College, Thiruvananthapuram. The course is specially designed to provide an understanding on the ethics of the planning, conduct, deliver clear written communication and reporting of research. The course has a well-defined syllabus structure and implementation plan which allows the students to understand the basics of research ethics. The course was co-ordinated by Dr. Veena Sureshbabu who planned/organized skills in qualitative and quantitative data analysis and various modes of presentation to ensure pro-active learning throughout the ethical study. The course duration was 30 days. This academic year 34 students enrolled for this course. The add on course started on 02/03/2021 and terminated on 31/3/2021. All the students attended the exit exam which was held on 10/04/2021, and certificate was also issued to them on the successful completion of the course. The course outcome has been achieved by all the students. The students were able to explain key research concepts and issues and read, comprehend, and explain research articles in their academic discipline.
